# The safety set

OceanMedix introduces medical kits for commercial fishing boats

Included in this OceanMedix kit are wound and fracture packages and prescription medications. an accident with one of the crew who had cut his hand. The crew took all the appropriate first aid steps to avoid complications, but by

the time they returned to port infection had set in and "true medical care was needed," says OceanMedix's Denny Emory.

The lobsterman was inquiring if OceanMedix had an antibiotic kit they could take with them on the seven- to 10-day trips. OceanMedix, which began marketing emergency and safety equipment to the recreation market in 2006,

had been considering moving more into the commercial market. In 2014 the company made its first foray into that field with the Commercial Vessel Defibrillator Kit (see "Comeback kit," *NF* Dec. '14, p. 60.).

Emory then talked with his business partner, Dr. Brent Blue, to see if they couldn't develop medical kits appropriate to commercial fishermen. That led to the development of three kits, an offshore medical kit, a smaller version of that kit and a kit for inshore fishermen.

The first to be released was the Fishing Vessel Medical Kit — Offshore (small) in July. (The Rhode Island lobstermen bought three of the prototypes.) The other two will come out by the end of the year.

The Fishing Vessel Medical Kit — Offshore (small) is for up to five people who will be away from medical care for at least 24 hours. The kit includes packages of instruments and medications, as well as packages to deal with wounds, burns and blisters, fractures and sprains and severe bleeding. And there's a prescription medication package.

Most fishermen aren't that well versed in taking care of injuries and illness, so the kit includes the 304-page "Marine Medicine, a Comprehensive Guide" by Drs. Eric A. Weiss and Michael Jacobs.

All of this comes contained in a watertight, shock- and crush-proof Pelican storm case.

The small Fishing Vessel Medical Kit is priced at \$595. When they are introduced, the Offshore Fishing Vessel Medical Kit will be \$955 and the Coastal version \$570. You can also purchase just the prescription medical package for \$395 or a severe bleeding kit for \$121.40.

## AT A GLANCE
